Newman Brothers is currently a live building restoration project. Birmingham Conservation Trust, who owns the building, would like to invite school children to witness part of the transformation of an old Victorian factory into a 'time capsule' heritage attraction and offices. Our tour guides will also tell children about the metal working trade, the people who used to work there, and the social history behind 100 years of production. Come back and visit us again when we are open (from the end of September) to see the complete transformation!

There is no charge to schools. You will need to provide your own transport.

For safety reasons we can only accommodate children (max 15) and teaching staff (max 5) on a tour. If you wish to bring a class of 30, why not spend the whole morning or afternoon in the Jewellery Quarter?
